Primary PE and Sport Premium

Penshurst Church of England Primary School received **£16,750** through the Government's Primary PE and Sport Premium Grant during the 2025–2026 academic year. The funding has been used to enhance the quality of physical education, increase opportunities for participation in sport and physical activity, and promote healthy, active lifestyles for all pupils.

Our aim is to ensure every child develops the skills, confidence and enthusiasm to enjoy being physically active both in school and beyond.

How the funding was used

During 2025–2026, funding was allocated to support:

Area	Investment
Continuing Professional Development (CPD) for staff	£400
Extra-curricular sports clubs and activities	£6,000
PE equipment and resources	£1,000
PE and School Sport memberships	£500
School Games Organiser (SGO) programme	£1,000
Participation in inter-school competitions	£1,200
Specialist sports coaches	£1,400
Additional swimming provision	£5,500

Impact

The funding has enabled us to:

- Provide a wide range of high-quality extra-curricular sporting opportunities.
- Increase participation in competitive sport through local School Games competitions.
- Enhance the quality of PE teaching through professional development and specialist coaching.
- Invest in equipment to improve the delivery of PE lessons.
- Continue to provide inclusive sporting opportunities for all pupils, including targeted support for pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and disadvantaged pupils.
- Strengthen pupils' confidence, teamwork, resilience and enjoyment of physical activity.

Swimming and Water Safety

We are particularly proud of the achievements of our Year 6 pupils in swimming.

In 2025–2026:

- **100%** of Year 6 pupils could swim at least **25 metres** confidently and competently.
- **100%** could use a range of swimming strokes effectively.
- **100%** could perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

An additional **£5,500** was invested in swimming provision, resulting in a **positive impact** on pupils' swimming attainment and water safety outcomes.

Inclusion

We are committed to ensuring that every child benefits from high-quality physical education regardless of need or background. During 2025–2026, funding was specifically targeted to improve sporting opportunities for:

- Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).
- Disadvantaged pupils.

This investment helped ensure that all children were able to participate, develop their skills and enjoy success in sport.

Looking Ahead

As part of our ongoing commitment to improving PE and school sport, we will continue to:

- Invest in staff professional development.
- Maintain a broad programme of extra-curricular clubs.
- Provide opportunities for pupils to participate in competitive sport.
- Work closely with the School Games Organiser and specialist coaches.
- Continue to promote lifelong participation in physical activity and healthy lifestyles for all pupils.
